Nurseradio.org Founder & Producer Recognized for Outstanding Contribution to Nurses

*First and Only Nurse-Focused Radio Programming Honored
Through Massachusetts Nurses Association Award*

October 12, 2004, Wellesley, MA – Nurseradio.org, the only nurse-focused radio programming in the country, today announced that its Founder and Program Director, Georgianna Donadio, DC, MSc, PhD, was the recipient of the MNA Advocate of the Year award at the Massachusetts Nurse Association's (MNA) annual convention, in Boston, on October 6, 2004. The MNA Nurse Advocate of the Year Award recognizes the contributions of an individual, who is not a nurse but has made outstanding contributions to nurses and the nursing profession.

Nurseradio.org is a non-profit organization that is dedicated to celebrating the global contributions of nurses in patient care and providing a voice for today's nurses.
